Full-Service Branch Opening in Kearney - Spring of 2019

Did you know that your credit union is chartered to serve the students, faculty, staff and alumni on all campuses of the University of Nebraska? As part of a long range plan to have a presence on all of the university campuses, we are happy to announce that the credit union will be opening a full-service branch in Kearney in the spring of 2019.

Cheryl Montgomery and Peggy Mak, Kearney staff members, have done a great job laying the ground work to grow membership in Kearney. Both work in our Lending Center,

located in an office building, and look forward to being in a new branch that will offer all the conveniences members now enjoy in Lincoln, including full-cash services.

The new branch will be located just up the street from the University of Nebraska-Kearney campus at the corner of 29th Street and 2nd Avenue.

“Convenience for our members is important to us. We know we have members in Kearney who need a full-service branch,” said Keith Kauffeld, University of Nebraska Federal Credit Union’s president and CEO. “This is something we’ve been considering for some time to better meet the needs of the Kearney community and the needs of the staff, faculty, students and alumni of UNK.

The new Kearney branch will be 2,250 square feet and will include a drive-up lane as well as a drive-up ATM. “We’ve had so many of our members express the need for cash services to fully use the credit union as their primary financial institution,” said Cheryl Montgomery, Kearney branch manager. “I know when we open the doors to our new Kearney branch this spring we will be greeted with lots of smiles. I’m looking forward to helping our members save time and money with all the wonderful products and services we have at the credit union.”

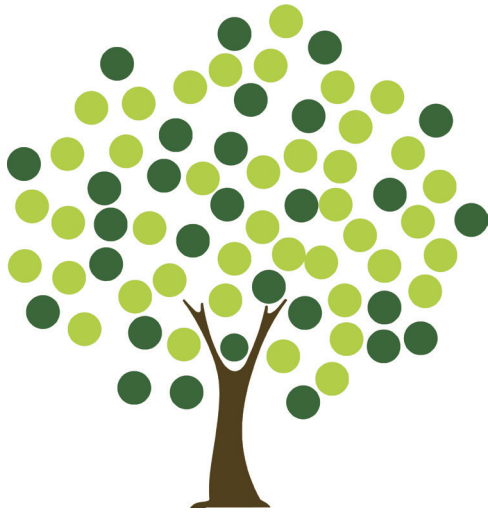
